North Delta

Robbery

In February 2011 there was one attempt robbery reported in North Delta. The victim, a store clerk, reported that a u/k female entered the store, went behind the counter and started demanding money. A brief struggle ensued and the u/k female left the store without obtaining money or merchandise. Delta Police is continuing the investigation.

Break and Enter Commercial

A total of 9 commercial break and enter incidents were reported in North Delta in February 2011. Several of the break-ins occurred in the industrial area of Annacis. Several compounds were broken into as a result of the locks and fences being cut.

Break and Enter Residential/Other/ Seasonal

In February 2011 there were a total of 13 residential break and enter incidents reported in North Delta. Method of entry consisted of prying or forcing a door or window open or homeowners leaving doors and windows insecure. In three incidents no entry was gained to the residence.

In terms of property stolen, this month thieves primarily targeted: Jewelry, laptops, electronics, TV's, bike, Identification and various other property.

Theft of Vehicle

During the month of February a total of 19 vehicles were reported stolen in North Delta. There were 3 incidents where the ignition was tampered with but no theft occurred.

Vehicles were stolen by punching the ignition and/or defeating the steering column. In February, thieves primarily targeted Honda Accord, Ford F150's and F350's. Some of the vehicles were recovered in Surrey and New Westminster.

Theft from Vehicle

A total of 36 vehicles were broken into in North Delta in February 2011. Forcible entry was used in most cases and the method of operation was by punching the driver's side door lock or smashing the side window. On some occasions the vehicles were left insecure. Items stolen had varied considerably and included the following: wallets, purses, Identification, GPS systems, credit cards and other miscellaneous items.

SOUTH DELTA – Ladner & Tsawwassen

Robbery

There were no robberies reported in Ladner and Tsawwassen.

Break and Enter Commercial

A total of 5 commercial break and enter incidents were reported in Ladner. In one incident an office window was pried open and two pallets of computers and clothing were stolen. This file is still under investigation. In another incident an employee of the company observed the front gate to the secured compound broken open and a u/k vehicle was in the compound. Police were called and arrived on scene and observed two males loading tires and rims into a panel van they had just stolen from the business. Police arrested the two males and the property was returned to the business.

There was no commercial break and enter in Tsawwassen in February.

Break and Enter Residential/Other/ Seasonal

In February there was a total of 6 reported residential break and enter incidents in South Delta. Entry to the residence was gained through insecure doors and locks being cut. Electronics, laptops and bags of chemicals and pesticides were stolen.

In one incident the suspects broke into a vacant house through an insecure window. Suspect(s) stole three wooden doors and 25 feet of copper piping.

Theft of Vehicle

In February Ladner reported 10 thefts of auto incidents and Tsawwassen reported 2 incidents. There was 1 incident where the ignition was tampered with but no theft occurred. One vehicle has been recovered in Surrey and the other vehicle was recovered down the street from where it was stolen.

Theft from Vehicle

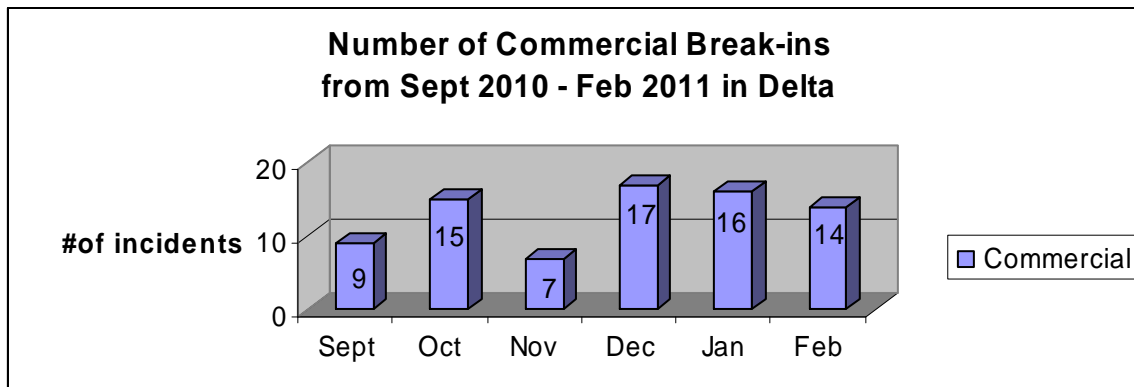
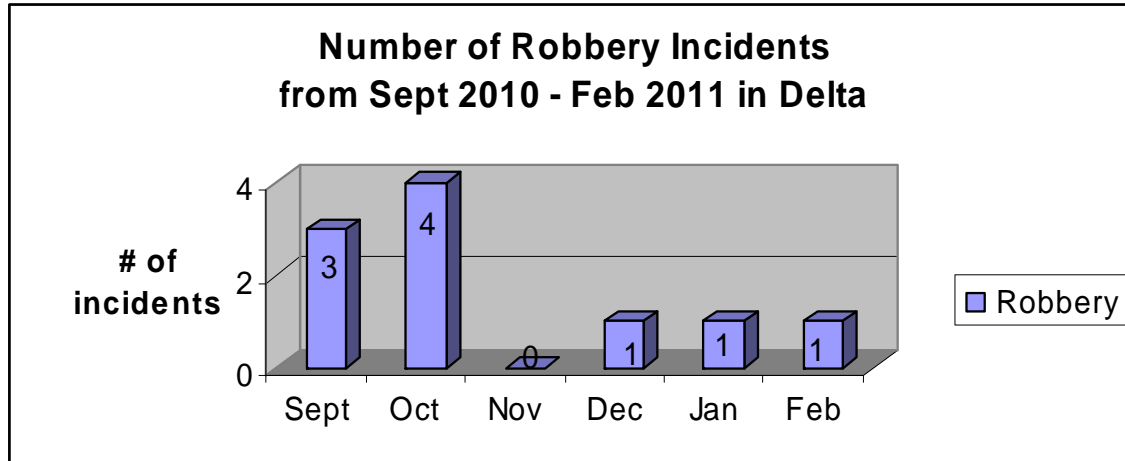
A total of 17 vehicles were broken into in Ladner and Tsawwassen in February 2011. The suspects gaining entry into the vehicles by smashing a window or punching the door lock. Some of the vehicles were left insecure. Suspect(s) appear to be looking for any items left within the vehicle including small change, wallets, GPS and electronics.

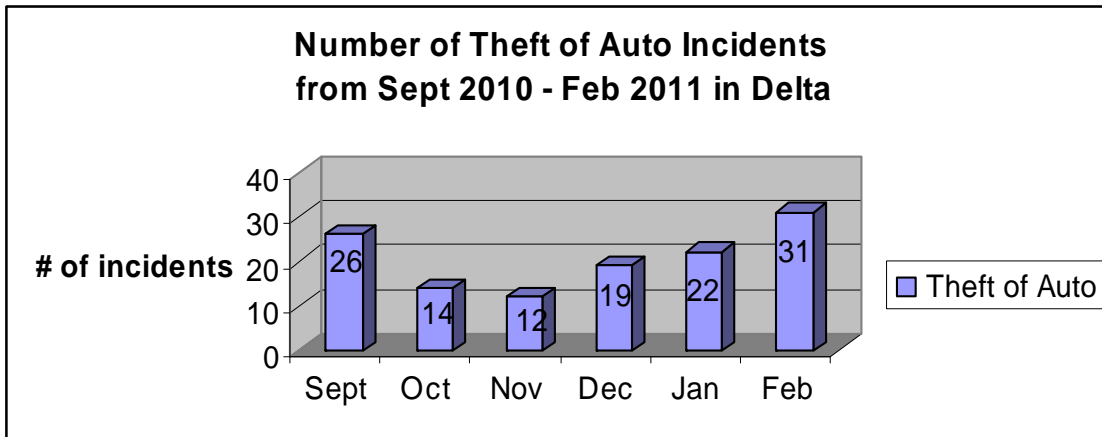
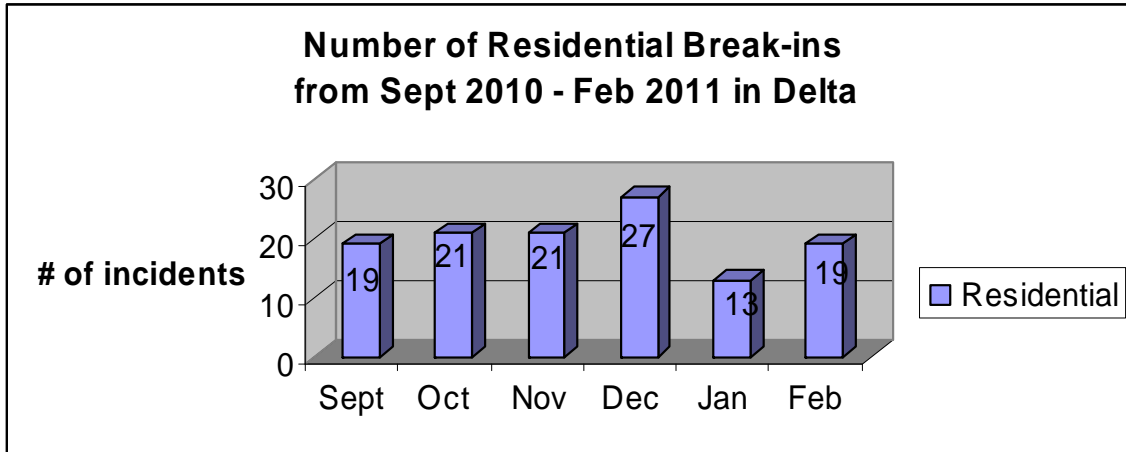
2011 Delta Crime Trends
