North Delta

Robbery

During the month of September there were two robberies reported in North Delta. There was one reported incident that involved youths. A group of youths surrounded a male and stole a skateboard and soccer ball from the victim. An arrest has been made on this file.

The other robbery was a bank robbery. A u/k male entered the bank and passed a note demanding money from the teller. Delta Police is continuing this investigation.

Break and Enter Commercial

A total of seven commercial break and enter incidents were reported in North Delta in September 2011. Several businesses were targeted along the Scott Rd Corridor. In several of the reports the suspect(s) cut through the drywall to enter the businesses. Several laptops and cell phone accessories were stolen. No arrests have been made.

In September there was also a report of underground parkades being broken into and several vehicles were entered and property was stolen.

Industrial Area

During the month of September there was one reported commercial break-in and one report of an attempt theft of vehicle in the industrial area in North Delta.

File#1: suspect(s) gained entrance to a compound by cutting the fence. Two insecure vehicles were entered and the face of the steering wheel and two airbags were stolen.

File#2: suspect(s) stole a commercial van which left secured and parked on the street in front of the business. The vehicle was recovered in Surrey.

Break and Enter Residential/Other/ Seasonal

In September 2011 there were a total of twelve residential break and enter incidents reported in North Delta. In several of the reported break and enters entry was gained by prying open the windows and doors to the residence. In terms of property stolen, thieves primarily targeted: jewelry, Canadian and foreign currency, electronics, Identification and various other property.

Theft of Vehicle

During the month of September a total of eight vehicles were reported stolen in North Delta. Vehicles were stolen by punching the ignition and/or defeating the steering column. The majority of the vehicles were stolen overnight or early in the morning from residential areas. Vehicles were recovered in Surrey and Langley.

Theft from Vehicle

A total of 45 vehicles were broken into in North Delta in September 2011. Forcible entry was used in most cases and the method of operation was by punching the driver's side door lock or smashing the side window. Items stolen had varied considerably and included the following: wallets, purses, Identification, GPS systems, credit cards and other miscellaneous items.

Robbery

There were two reported robberies in Tsawwassen for the month of September. In the first incident a u/k suspect male entered the bank and produced a note demanding money from the till. The teller gave the suspect male some cash and he fled the scene. The other robbery occurred in a retail business where a suspect male entered the business demanding money. The employee gave the male some money and the suspect fled. Delta Police have arrested an individual responsible for these robberies.

The robbery that occurred in Ladner was a report of a bank robbery. In this incident the suspect entered the bank and demanded money. The teller gave the suspect some money and he fled the scene. An arrest has been made.

Break and Enter Commercial

A total of two commercial break and enter incidents were reported in South Delta during the month of September.

Suspect(s) smashed the back access door gaining entry to the business. Once inside the premise suspect(s) smashed the glass on the vending machine. Suspect(s) caused significant damage to a safe by prying the top section off with a crow bar, envelopes were opened and coins were strewn all over. A total of \$600 in cash was stolen.

Industrial Area

During the month of September there was one reported commercial break-ins in the industrial area in Ladner.

File#1: suspect(s) cut a hole in the south fence and entered the business through an insecure door. A camera and some tools were stolen, approximate value of items stolen \$2000.

Break and Enter Residential/Other/ Seasonal

In September there were a total of seven reported residential break and enter incidents in Ladner and Tsawwassen. In one incident suspect(s) attempted to enter the residence but were scared off by the house alarm. In another incident a residence under construction was entered by twisting off the lock on the main door of the residence. A bathroom faucet and miscellaneous paint tools were stolen. The other two incidents that

Theft of Vehicle

There were five reported thefts of vehicles and four attempt thefts of vehicles in South Delta in September 2011. None of the vehicles have been recovered.

Theft from Vehicle

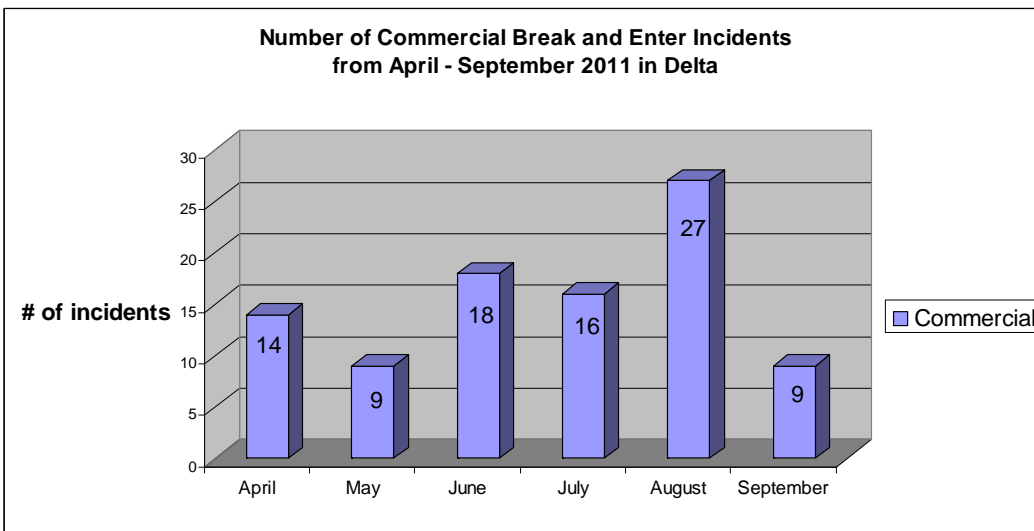
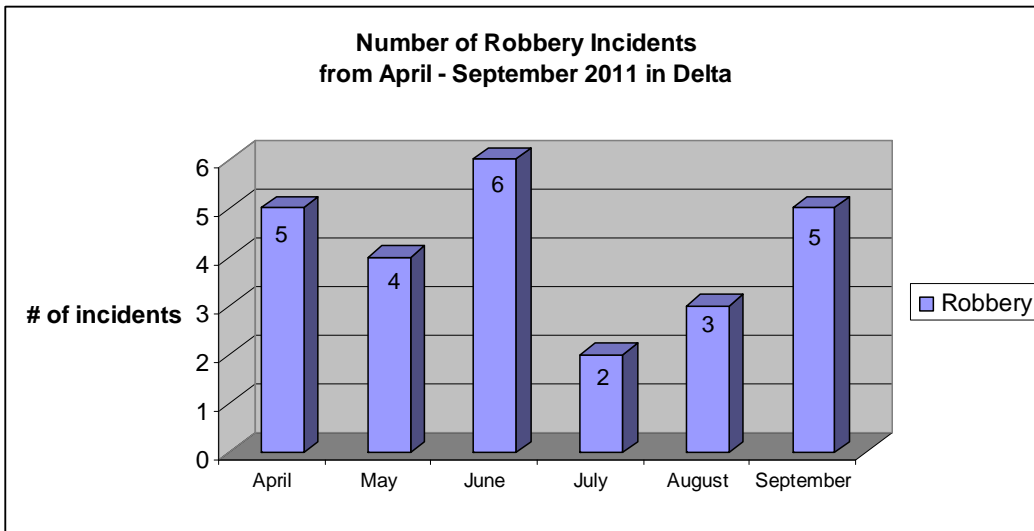
